The Cannon County Election Commission met on April 14, 2014.  
All members were present with 2 visitors and AOE Mankin.

1. Chairman Davenport called the meeting to order.
2. Studd led the prayer.
3. All recited the pledge.

Studd asked about placing videos on website. Has this been discussed in prior meetings? Mankin stated her office had been too busy to work on this. Studd is willing to upload the videos of the meetings onto the web site. Studd made a motion to do this with Grosch seconding. Motion passed.

4. Minutes from March meeting were viewed by each member.  
Gannon made a motion to accept minutes and Studd seconded.  
All in favor.
5. 69 new voter registrations were reviewed by Gannon and Grosch  
No problems were found.

6. & 7 Mankin asked about polling place hours  
Election day. Patrick stated we have been opening 7 til 7 in the past and this is usually stated by the media. Gannon made a motion for these hours and Studd seconded. All in favor.  
absentee counting board was discussed. Patrick asked Mankin if she believed there would be 100 or more. Mankin did not believe so.  
Patrick made the motion the commission be the counting board convening at 4:00 pm for this purpose. Gannon seconded. All in favor.

Mankin stated because ATT does not now use local towers some phones would not pick up at Auburntown, Gassaway and Woodland and this would be a problem election day. DTC stated they could supply 3 phones (one at each of these locations) for a total cost of \$120 with the assurance they would work.

The budget amendment moving funds from election workers to health insurance approved at the prior meeting had been signed off by Mike Gannon. The auditor advised this is the way this should be done on anything but a salary amendment. This is a change from prior years.

Dorinda advised some new people had signed up to be pollworkers and these were read and approved. Robert and Jean Francis, Randall Reid, and Lois Larimer. Studd made a motion to approve workers and Gannon seconded. Motion passed.


workers representing each party were approved for the polling locations which needed this because of a change in poll workers which was Short Mt both precincts and Gassaway.


A person had marked he was a convicted felon in error at the Dept of Safety when he registered. Dorinda had checked on this as much as possible. Patrick made a motion to accept registration with Gannon seconding. Motion approved.

Mankin reminded commission of the Taceo meeting June 1-4 and that early voting begins April 16 – May 1. She mentioned we are in line to allow wine in groceries referendum on the city ballot. The city would have to request and pay for this. It could pass if 10% of the voters who voted in the last governor's election approve it.

8. Other business - Patrick inquired to Mankin if machine totals were checked by paper registrations each day at early voting before workers left. Mankin stated these were checked before anyone left so if there were questions it would be fresh on each worker's mind.

9. Gannon made a motion to adjourn. Grosch seconded. All in favor
