

The Cannon County Election Commission met on Aug 18, 2014 for their monthly meeting. All members were in attendance along with AOE Mankin.

1. Meeting called to order by Chairman Davenport.
2. Opening prayer was led by Grosch.
3. All recited the pledge.
4. The minutes of the July meeting were approved after one change to item 7 which should have read motion failed. This motion was about moving the election commission meeting back to the election office.
5. Election results were certified with all members signing.
6. There were no new voter registrations to be approved.
7. AOE Mankin gave her report about the past election. Considering the electrical outage, all went well. The fire departments were commended for their assistance.
8. Absentee counter to be used in November election after Studd made the motion With Grosch seconding. Studd, Grosch, Gannon voted yes with Patrick voting no.
9. Purchase of a generator was discussed with Davenport stating he would look into This along with prices, capabilities, output, extension cords, etc.
