The Cannon County election commission met for their monthly meeting on October 13, 2014. All members were present along with AOE Mankin.

1. Chm Davenport called the meeting to order.
2. Opening prayer was led by Matt Studd.
3. All recited the pledge.
4. Minutes of the September 14 meeting were approved after Gannon made the motion and Studd seconded. All in favor.
5. 52 voter registrations were reviewed. There are now 8740 registered voters. 120 additional persons have registered since the August election
6. Mankin gave a report that all is ready for the election. Polling hours were agreed to be the same as the previous election 7 til 7. The commission will be the counting board due to the number of absentee ballots. WBRY can set up by the new door. On the prior Thursday there had been an issue with domestic violence. Mike Gannon came to the meeting and stated that perhaps after the ambulance center moves to their new location the domestic violence office could be moved to where the garage now is. The commission was informed about the one day TACEO meeting in Clarksville.
7. The need for a generator was discussed along with wattage enough for the lights and computers. Mike Grosch has a generator. No action was taken and this was tabled to a later date.
8. Voter ID and the amendments on the upcoming ballot were discussed.
9. Grosch made a motion to adjourn meeting and Gannon seconded. Meeting adjourned.
