



**ELECTION COMMISSION
MEETING
SCHEDULED FOR MONDAY May 19,
2014
5:30 P.M.**

**HELD AT THE CANNON COUNTY
COURTHOUSE
MAIN STREET
WOODBURY, TENN.**

The Cannon County Election Commission met on May 19, 2014 for the regular monthly meeting. All commissioners were in attendance along with AOE Mankin. 4 visitors were present.

1. Chairman Davenport called the meeting to order.
2. Studd led the prayer.
3. All recited the pledge of allegiance.
4. A motion was made by Studd to approve the April minutes with Grosch Seconding. Motion passed.
5. One voter registration was reviewed.
6. The past election was discussed. There were 175 early votes with 14 absentees Being cast by mail. 880 voted in the May election. The election was certified with members signing the certification. Studd made the motion and Patrick seconded. All in favor.
The cost of the election was discussed with \$11,954.69 being paid so far. Additional cost will be submitted. Grosch asked about how the phones worked. There was a problem at Woodland due to the worker not understanding using The phone. No other problems were reported.
Davenport discussed campaign signs. Studd stated if on property blocking Or on your property and you did not grant permission, contact the candidate Or his campaign.
7. Discussion regarding tabulation of machine totals on election night was had. Do We want to use the Fann's or get someone out of town? Problems with prior years using Microvote was discussed. It was decided that there was no problem With using Fred and Glen Fann.
8. Mankin handed out the voter handbook and was commended for constructing it.
9. Making worker ID's for election day was discussed. It would cost around \$400. Members thought this to be a good idea and instructed Mankin to find out more. A registration for Carol Phann was discussed. She states she is not a felon and Marked incorrectly. Grosch made a motion to allow the registration with Patrick Seconding. All in favor. The card reader for absentee votes was discussed. Patrick made a motion to not use in August election. Gannon seconded. Motion Passed.
Election workers pay was discussed increasing the pay from \$100 to \$120 for Poll workers with \$20 for the training. Officer of elections \$140 with \$20 for Training. The difficulty of finding election workers was discuss because of The long work day exceeding 12 hours. Patrick made the motion to approve the Increase with Studd seconding. All in favor
Budget was not discussed and it was decided to devote a special meeting to this. The court room was filling up for a different meeting.
10. Meeting adjourned with Patrick making the motion and Gannon seconding.
